Saskatchewan Writers' Guild Member Survey 2024

Summary Report

Background

The Saskatchewan Writers' Guild (SWG) has engaged its members, program participants and other stakeholders to:

- 1) better understand who its members are, and
- 2) evaluate and inform program and service offerings.

The survey took respondents approximately 10 to 15 minutes to complete and was confidential and anonymous. Respondents were encouraged to complete the survey on a desktop, laptop or tablet for a better experience. As an incentive to participate, respondents were encouraged to provide their name at the end of the survey to be entered in a draw for one of 10 prizes of \$50 gift cards (five for SWG members, and five for all others).

The survey ran from Tuesday, February 6 to Thursday, February 29. The survey indicated a summary of findings would be shared in April 2024.

The Saskatchewan Writers Guild received no questions about the survey. Technical issues with the survey were directed to the swg2024survey@gmail.com; no questions were received.

Summary

- Members join the Saskatchewan Writers' Guild to be a part of a writing community and access programs and networking opportunities.
- They get great value and support from membership; some cite cost as a barrier.
- Members see SWG taking some actions for accessibility of programs and events.
- Members see a need for more Indigenous presenters and content also the need greater diversity in the membership for example BIPOC, 2SLGBTQ+, people with disabilities. Greater diversity of genres was also a theme.
- There is an opportunity to attract former and new members by promoting: how to join; retail discounts; programs and publications; volunteering or jobs.
- Great value and supportive community are likely the competitive advantage.
- This may be an opportune time to review program and publications offerings and consider member feedback when deciding priorities.
- 369 people completed the survey. 20% of respondents are 40 or under; 50% are newer members (5 years or less). 63% live in large community 50,000 people+
- Respondents were happy to hear from SWG, participate in the survey and learn about the programs and services.
- Member testimonials could be included in marketing materials. Follow-up research with survey respondents can be used to help make decisions about programming.





1. Are you a member of the Saskatchewan Writers' Guild? SELECT ONE





2. What is your membership status SELECT ONE





3. How long have you been a member of the Saskatchewan Writers' Guild? SELECT ONE





4. Why have you chosen to be a member of the Saskatchewan Writers' Guild?












12. How many SWG workshops or events (virtual) did you attend last year (2023)? SELECT ONE


















44. What genres do you write? CHECK ALL THAT APPLY










